USE OF PERSONAL TECHNOLOGY AND COMMUNICATION DEVICES FOR INSTRUCTIONAL PURPOSES

All of the conditions in the Clark County School District’s Acceptable Use Policy apply to the use of student-owned or student-provided technology and communication devices that are used for instructional purposes. Student-owned or student-provided technology and communication devices will be used at the discretion of the classroom teacher for educational purposes, with approval from the school administration. Students may need to register the device, following the school’s procedures. This may allow tracking of the device in the case of loss or misuse. The device is the sole responsibility of the student. If the student does not follow the CCSD policies and regulations, the Acceptable Use Policy, and classroom procedures, the privilege to use a personally owned device on school property for instructional purposes may be revoked.

Students must understand that they will follow the teacher and school procedures for when and where to use a student-owned or student provided technology and communication device for educational purposes. They must understand that this privilege may be revoked if they violate the CCSD policies and regulations, the Acceptable Use Policy, and/or classroom procedures.

PERMISSION FOR THE USE OF PERSONAL TECHNOLOGY AND COMMUNICATION DEVICES

I give permission for my student to use a student-owned/student-provided technology/communication device for educational purposes at school. The District, school, and its staff are not responsible or liable for any loss, theft, damage, maintenance, or repair of a student-owned or student-provided technology device.

I have read and understand the CCSD Personal Device Student Agreement on the reverse of this release. I understand and will abide by these guidelines. I further understand that any violation may result in the loss of my network privileges, the loss of use of personal and district device privileges at school, and/or other disciplinary action. I also understand that the District may collect and examine/search any personal student-owned or student-provided technology or communication device if there is a reasonable suspicion that the student has violated CCSD Policy 5136, any other District policy or regulation, or state or federal law.

This agreement, along with parent approval of the network access form (CCF-588) must be signed and on file at the school prior to using a student-owned or student-provided technology or communication device.

CCSD PERSONAL TECHNOLOGY AND COMMUNICATION DEVICE STUDENT AGREEMENT

The Board of Trustees recognizes that student-owned or student-provided personal technology and communication devices can enhance instruction and student achievement.

The use of personal technology to provide educational material is a privilege. If abused, the privilege can be revoked. When the appropriate use of devices is respected, it benefits the learning environment. Students and parents/guardians must adhere to all Board policies and regulations, the CCSD Acceptable Use Policy, and all classroom procedures.

- During instructional time, the device must:
 - Be turned off and remain off unless the device is being used for a specific educational activity in compliance with CCSD Policy 5136.
 - If use is permitted by the teacher, the device must be in silent mode unless otherwise directed by the teacher.
 - Not be used to cheat on assignments/tests or for non-instructional purposes.
 - Only be used to access files or internet sites which are relevant to the classroom curriculum.
 - Access the internet using the Clark County School District network. The school's network filters will be applied to the CCSD network access to the internet and may not be circumvented.
 - Be turned off upon the teachers' request.
- Students take full responsibility for student owned/provided devices at all times. The school is not responsible for the security of the device.
- The device may not be used to record, transmit, or post photographic images or video on campus unless assigned by the teacher as allowed by the CCSD Acceptable Use Policy. The subjects of the image or video also must have a signed publicity release (CCF-588).
- Personal technology devices must be charged prior to bringing them to school and devices must run on battery power while at school.
- Students remain subject to all other school behavior rules.
- The District may collect and examine/search any personal student-owned or student-provided technology or communication device if there is a reasonable suspicion that the student has violated this agreement, CCSD Policy 5136, any other District policy or regulation, or state or federal law.

Definition of Personal Technology and Communication Devices

"Technology" means portable electronic devices used for instructional purposes. All devices must allow access to the Internet through a fully functional web browser and be capable of accessing the Clark County School District guest network. Devices may include but are not limited to: smartphones, iPads, iPods, laptops, netbooks, tablet computers, and eReaders.

Security and Damages

The responsibility to keep student owned/provided devices secure rests with the individual owner. CCSD or its employees are not liable for any device stolen or damaged on campus. If a device is stolen or damaged, it will be handled through the administrative office in the same manner as other personal artifacts that are impacted in similar situations.
