



# Things You Should Know About Your iPad



**Upgrade to 7.1.1:** This is an important upgrade for security and accessibility.

**Turn off in-app purchases:** Go to *Settings, General, Restrictions* and tap *Enable Restrictions* to selectively enable restrictions for your apps, content, Game Center, and more. If you're worried about other people breaking your bank account on in-app purchases, just disable *In-App Purchases* under the 'Allowed Content' setting.

**Change your email signature:** Don't be one of those people who leave the default 'Sent from my iPad' signature on all their messages. Change it in *Settings, Mail, Contacts, Calendars, Signature* to something more interesting.


**Put a passcode on your iPad:** Go to *Settings, General*

**Make your passcode more complicated:** iOS defaults to a four-number passcode, but you can turn it off by going to *Settings, Passcode, enter your Passcode/ Passcode Lock, Turn off the Simple Passcode*. Now you can use any full keyboard password to lock the iPad. The password also helps to encrypt your mail and attachments on the iPad, so you probably want to make it safer than a four-digit number.

**Restrict mature content:** Go to *Settings, General, Restrictions* and tap *Enable Restrictions* to selectively apply controls on your apps, content, Game Center, and more. You can use this setting to limit mature content on your new iPad by disabling explicit-language recognition, blocking podcasts that have the "Explicit" tag, or blocking movies, TV shows, and apps that are rated for mature audiences.

**Download the free iPad User's Guide:** You may have noticed that your iPad didn't come with a big printed manual--that's not Apple's style. However, you can download the PDF version of the iPad User's Guide from [Apple's website](http://support.apple.com/manuals/), (<http://support.apple.com/manuals/>) or you can read it in iBooks (iBooks is a free download if you don't have it). Make sure to download the iPad Manual for the version of iOS you're currently using!

## Safari:

- Add SECTA.us to home screen – it will look like an app
- Bookmarks - Click on the Share/Save icon  (to the left of the address bar) to make it easy to return to favorite websites. To see and organize your bookmarks, click the book to the right of the address bar.
- Items that are opened as a PDF can be saved in iBooks by touching in the upper right area of the page (below the Browser Tabs) to display "Open in iBooks". You can then move it into a collection.

## Main Screen:

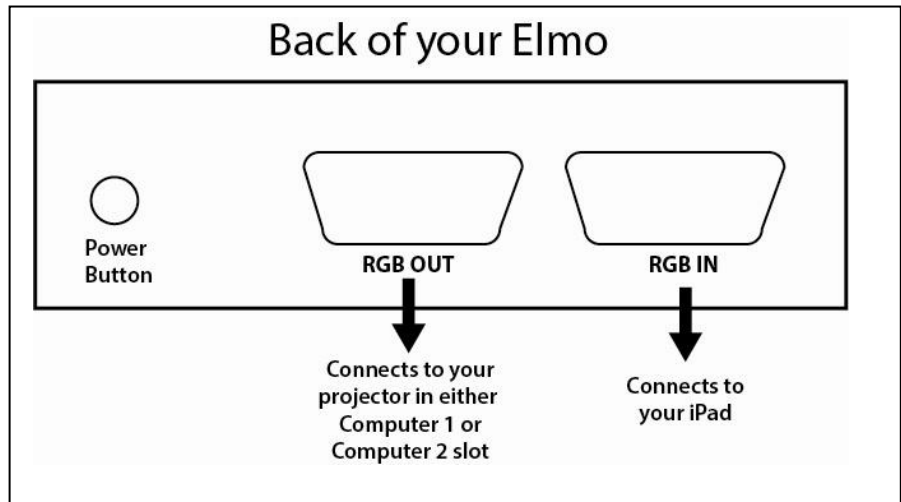
- To **remove open apps from memory** (which you may not even know are still active), double click the HOME button twice. Throw them away by flicking them up off the screen.
- To **close apps** (HOME button or 4 fingers)
- To **take a screen shot** of the page you are on hold down the HOME button and the Sleep/Wake button on the side of the iPad.
- To **delete app icons**, touch and hold any icon until they wiggle. Be careful to tap just "X" on the icon you want to delete. To stop the wiggling, click on the HOME button.
- To **move an app (organize them)**, touch and hold any icon until they wiggle, and then drag them around. Be careful to not click the "X" which will delete the app.

**Settings:** The Wi-Fi is built in and always searching for a network.

- Airplane Mode – This allows you to use the iPad for reading or playing a game while on an airplane. It prevents the Wi-Fi and Bluetooth from searching for a connection.
- Wi-Fi – *Settings, Wi-Fi, Choose a Network.* If you have Wi-Fi at home, the iPad will automatically detect your network and all you need to provide is your router’s password. Going to Starbucks? Use your iPad anywhere it says Free Wi-Fi. These Internet Cafés typically do not need a password. During your summer travels, connect to the hotel Wi-Fi by asking the Front Desk since all can be different. Overall, we recommend not making purchases while on an unsecured network.

**It’s easily to switch between iPad and Elmo:**

- The iPad can be used in place of your computer
- With the purchase of a monitor Y splitter, you could connect your computer, iPad and Elmo to the same projector and switch between all 3 devices.



**Downloading Apps from the App Store:**

- Your App Store Id is tied to your department, and you need to find out the department’s App Store ID and Password. All department purchases will require you to submit the request to Teresa Yeoman and she will supply you a Redeem Code.
- Even if the app is free, you need the Apple ID and Passcode to download the app.
- For Personal (free or paid) purchases, you should use your own Apple ID. Create your personal Apple ID through the App Store (at the bottom). That way your apps will follow you even if you don’t have that iPad. Many people recommend using a \$20 iTunes card instead of your Credit Card for purchases.
- Down the following FREE apps right away:
  - Interact – the first time it will ask for your Server Name. Use **fc.ccsd.net**
  - Curriculum Engine – Use your regular Interact ID and Password
  - Evernote and/or OneNote – We should be promoting these for note taking
  - Dropbox (Feel free to use Laura or Pat as a reference!)
